Mark McCormick and Nathan Morrell went though to the regional final which took place on Monday 13th July 2009 after winning a series of heats in the Humber Sub-Region. The regional final held at the Royal Armouries in Leeds was attended by 12 schools from the Region. The pupils took part in a challenge to design and make a camp for the Bloodhound SSC team, whose car is attempting the world land speed record.

They also designed an innovative building with separate sleeping & bathroom arrangements for men and women and an office with a satellite communication system.
